Within 12 hrs of this statement being made Gatwick expansion plans were open to public debate generated by the owners of Gatwick. Statements made have clearly been shown to be misleading and the Council will have no reason to believe what Gatwick management say in future.

Response: Councillors have considered this application at length and after

hearing the views of residents overlooking or adjacent to the site and who expressed considerable opposition to the proposal in terms of the height of the building, the positioning of the solar panels and the positioning of the building in relation to the site

boundary.

The Parish Council makes the following comments:

 Councillors are deeply unhappy about the positioning of the solar panels to overlook the street. These can be viewed from the village centre, particularly from first-floor windows.

- An alternative position for the solar panels, if there is insufficient light on the north facing side, would be to place them at ground level.
- The trees in front of Crockers Wood Cottages are deciduous and when not in leaf the barn will be clearly visible from the cottages.
- Councillors consider that the barn is too high and that it would be preferable to have it as a single storey with the Groom's accommodation on the same level as the stables.
- The positioning of the barn would be acceptable to Councillors if it remains where it is BUT as a single storey building.
- If the building remains as a two storey building it should be moved right to the edge of the north western boundary as far north as possible so that it not visible from Crockers Wood Cottages.

125c(i) An addendum to the PC's response to MO/2012/1295 The Livery, Crockers Farm, had been sent to MVDC to the effect that the PC is satisfied with the applicant's response that only 15% of the panels overlook the street, that broken views of the panels can be seen when passing the first bay of the elevated position of the locked off parking area and No 1 Crockers Cottages on

Wolverns Lane and that from the elevated position of the water tank and tarmacked parking positions outside the Pub the panels cannot be seen.

It was emphasised that the Council supports green and sustainable energy but is wary of the difficulties of removing solar panels once installed. It was also noted in the response from MVDC that when dealing with planning applications the issue of solar should be addressed on the drawings so they are known about upfront.

126A. NEIGHBOURHOOD PLANS

Details of the Proposed Designation of the Ockley Neighbourhood Area had been received from MVDC together with the Proposal for a Neighbourhood Development Plan for Ockley. Responses are required by 14th December 2012.

It was suggested that if CPC were to go down the road of a Neighbourhood Plan a Steering Group would need to be set up within <u>each</u> the three ward communities to approach and involve the schools, churches and organisations within those communities.

Clarification would be sought on the above and draft document prepared for the December PC meeting (17.12.12). The NP could be carried out in tandem with Ockley as the influences within Ockley and Capel are fairly similar.

126B. HIGHWAYS MATTERS

1) <u>Gritting</u>: The Smith's Charity has given 5 grit boxes to the Parish – 1 for Coldhharbour, 2 for Beare Green and 3 to Capel. Each is supplied with 2 x 25kg sacks of grit salt and a shovel. In Capel these are sited one at the north end of the Village Hall, by the dustbins at the end of the Church path and at Almshouses.

1a. Highways has issued the PC with a grit spreader and sufficient grit to last the winter. To be is to be used on the pavements in the centre of Capel village to grit pavements immediately prior to snow fall to reduce the need for highways gangs to remove snow from pavements in the rural areas. Only one machine is available this year for the whole Parish and will be used as a trial, if successful an additional machine will be provided for winter 2013/14.

A suitable central place in Capel is needed to store the gritter and a location to store a hippo bag of grit plus a team of volunteers to do the spreading at short notice!

2). Surrey Offer / Lengthman's Scheme.

Following on from the Forum of Local Parish Councils meeting the Dorking Rural Highways Hub Steering Group has been set up with two key members from each of the six participating Parishes. Projects are to be funded through the Local Committee.

In order to be able to establish the principal of this funding each Hub Council has submitted a small project for 2013. Capel has asked for £1,000 (this year's cost) for the maintenance of Markham Park Copse and adjacent parking bays- a cost currently born by CPC.

This will be for a trial period only after which it is hoped that it could be expanded to include interested parties from Dorking Hills.

The first meeting of the Forum takes place on Monday 26th November.

- 3. <u>Vicarage Lane gullies</u> have been partly cleared, but further use of the Jetta Lorry is required a wait of 3 months minimum.
- **126C. WARD MATTERS :** *Beare Green* (i) Project OverHall -£50K SOS grant has been withdrawn for unknown reasons and told not to re apply. More active people needed to progress the project in David Lloyd's absence. Coffee and Tea Shop (Fridays pm) very successful and increasing community spirit. Vicki Locke is back taking part. Calendar of local places has been produced.
- (ii) The promise of white lines and a marked up bus stop area in Old Horsham Road is to be followed up with Cllr Clack.

Capel- Action on Squatters: Recorded under Police Matters. MVDC Enforcement Officer informed. *Coldharbour*(i) Fibre optic likely to existing cabinets before Christmas. BT Infinity likely to be operational by end December /early January.(ii)The £300 promised in lieu of a celebration for Coldharbour for being one of the BT Infinity winners has been received into the PC's bank account.
