085d UPDATE ON EUROPA OIL PLATFORM APPEAL

1) SCC has no Highways witness. David Boswell to explain to the Inspector that the removal of the trees in Coldharbour Lane does not alter the Highways issues in that this will have the effect of (i) weakening the banks by

destabilising them (ii) lorries will cause greater impact by travelling closer to the verge and increasing the likelihood of its erosion.

2) The Inspector has indicated that more weight is given to Witness Evidence therefore it was agreed that D. Boswell be a witness on Wednesday 18th July. P Garber will also appear am on Wednesday 18th July. DB has indicated that there will be no extra charge for him giving evidence at the Inquiry. The PC threshold remains at £5,000.

Mr McLachlan extended thanks to DB for his help. Peter Tindall (LHAG) and Clive Smith AONB had given very good evidence at the Inquiry. J Bradley (Environmentalist LHAG) had his evidence dismissed (it was suggested a formal complaint should be made to his institute)

3) Prior to the conclusion of the Inquiry it would be necessary to discuss Conditions that might be attached to any prospective planning application.

085e UPDATE ON GODWINS SITE

J Straw and C Robertson had confirmed that they were no longer objecting to the site coming forward. The planning application is expected in August. A written amendment was expected from the author of publicity calling into question the PC's integrity to commit a minimum of £200,000 to Beare Green from the easement sale that would be necessary to allow the site to be developed.

086A. FUTURE AVAILABILITY OF PLANNING DOCUMENTS

a) Although A Bircher, Strategic Director Planning MVDC, had given assurances that planning documents would be available to PC's if required it is noted that planning applications to MVDC are submitted either direct to the planning portal or in document form. For those submitted direct to the planning portal MV will not hold hard copies of plans.

The PC to consider purchase of equipment to provide clear reproduction of scale plans for PC meetings where planning matters are being discussed. Estimates to be obtained:

- for purchase of a laptop for downloading plans direct from the MV website at Planning meetings and meetings of the full Council.
- purchase of a portable small screen for use with the above
- possible purchase of a printer as a backup for reproducing scale plans.

MVDC to be approached for a grant towards funding the above and for the provision of Infinity Broadband access in venues where it is not provided by BT ie. Capel Village Hall, JV Hall. (NB. BT is committed to provide access to BT infinity at the Beare Green Village Hall and the Capel Youth Centre)

086B HIGHWAYS MATTERS

- 1) At the request of Markham Rd / Bakers Way residents Highways have erected 2 posters alerting drivers to children playing near the road. However residents would like further action by mail dropping residents alerting them to the situation. This would have to be a resident's initiative.
- 2) The speed limit in Temple Lane A new 40MPH sign had appeared in Temple Lane, Capel. Because there was no sign in evidence prior to this it was not apparent that the speed limit was raised from 30 to 40MPH some time ago. The residents of Temple Lane are complaining about the dangers of

such a high speed limit. Cllr Clack has been asked whose decision it was and who was consulted about the change.

The Lane is used by heavy farm machinery, logging vehicles, delivery vehicles, 4 X 4's, farm trucks and resident's private vehicles, Also there are 10 dwellings off the Lane, all with children or grandchildren in close proximity to the traffic. Aldhurst Farm has access onto the lane - dairy cows cross the lane on a regular basis and there are other animals of various types likely to be in the lane; the lane is intersected by three bridle / foot paths and is well used by horse riders and pedestrians alike. A speed limit of 40MPH under such conditions would seem not only dangerous but a totally inappropriate. The PC is enquiring how this situation came about and whether measures can be taken to reduce the limit back to 30MPH or even 20MPH.

3) The Clerk is to write to Jason Russell, Assistant Director of Highways regarding the jetting of gullies. All of the gullies in Vicarage Lane between its intersection with The Street and Misbrooks Green Road and all the gullies in The Street, Capel are in need of jetting. All these gullies have been blocked since the autumn of 2011. The PC will request that there is more investment in equipment and the necessary manpower to clear the backlog of blocked drains and that more frequent maintenance should be provided in future.

086C WARD MATTERS

Beare Green: (i) Update on Project OverHall- Committee members are currently itemising their requirements for the hall. Priority is being given to the installation of disabled toilets. It was suggested that the location of the toilets in the refurbished / rebuilt Hall should be clarified prior to a planning application (expected in August) being submitted. A new BGCA Committee has been formed with Pam Marsh as Chairman. The OverHall team is investigating forming an Industrial & Provident Society as a 'not-for-profit' company to manage the Hall.

A request was made that the PC be sent an advanced copy of the planning application

- (ii) <u>Co-opted member for Beare Green</u> -Michelle Watson (in attendance) is interested in joining the PC as a Co opted Councillor for Beare Green. Documents to be forwarded prior to August meeting.
- (iii) Old Horsham Rd verges and parking. Alignment of the kerb leading into Oakdene Cottages off Old Horsham Road, to avoid running over the verge, has already been written into the Crest development proposal for the Godwins site. It is proposed that the PC also requests that Crest agrees to progress, in the same manner, the placing of wooden bollards at intervals in the verge from the intersection of Old Horsham Road with Merebank up to the intersection of Old Horsham Road with Hawkesmoore Drive; this to prevent any parking on the verge. The Clerk to discuss the above and the relevant history with Highways.

<u>Capel</u>; Street lights, currently on 24/7 in Vicarage Lane and Bakers Way, had been reported to Highways.

<u>Coldharbour</u>: (i) High speed broadband:- date for enablement now set at end of September 2012. BT currently optimising the remaining copper wire.

Further information available on the BT website. It is expected that most houses in Coldharbour will never get Broadband.

(ii)Richard Keen will be cutting the grass 'triangle' and the church hedge and will remove all arisings.

086F PARISH MAINTENANCE

- 1) Councillors approved Rob Jochimsen's quote of £605. 00 ex VAT to cut the Village Hall car park hedges, Mortimer Rd and the allotment hedges. Last year this was £595.00 ex VAT. Councillors also accepted his quote of £30.00 ex VAT to cut the roadside Misbrooks Green hedge and a short stretch on the RHS (going north) by Sharks Barn
 - Mr Cox asked that the Misbrooks Green Rd hedges on either side of the Rd at Hillhouse Farm be cut – this is not PC land. The Clerk to contact Highways.
- 2) The 'Capel' sign in the Pre School hedge has had to be removed as the post supporting it was rotten and broke off at ground level. The sign and wrought iron bracket need cleaning up / re painting but a new 9X9inch, 20ft post would be required to mount the sign back to its original. The sign was erected in memory of Mrs King and her daughter Ruth Harwood, at present it is unknown who paid for this. Mrs Pearson to follow up.

3) **Dog Fouling Campaign in Mole Valley:** MVDC has produced a 'Clean it up' summer leaflet advice for dog fouling and two fouling posters of Mole Valley's own making.

MVDC hope to send out the leaflet to particular problem areas through the post, but funding is not available for this until April 2013.

 The A3 posters by 'Keep Britain Tidy' were more acceptable than the MVDC own. The Clerk to laminate the A3 posters provided and to request a further.
